Noise at the workplace Checklist

What is the level of noise exposure in your company? Noise is unwanted, annoying or harmful sound.

The main risks are:

- Fatigue, stress, error rate
- Communication problems
- Irreversible hearing damage (noise-induced hearing loss)

With this checklist you will get a better grip on such risks.

1. Fill in the check list

If you answer a question with «no» or «partially», you need to take action. Make a note of necessary actions to take on the last page. If a question is not applicable to your business, cross it out.

2. Take action



Determination of noise exposure

- 1 Is the level of noise exposure known for the individual workplaces and various jobs or various activities?
- 2 Is it known which employees are exposed to noise levels above the occupational exposure limit?

Occupational exposure limit value: $L_{EX, Bh} \ge 85 \text{ dB}(A)$, based on one day. More details on this can be found in the noise level table for your sector. Directory of all tables: www.suva.ch/86005.d

Marking of noise zones, sources of noise

3 Are workstations, equipment and access to zones with a sound level exceeding 85 dB (A) marked with the mandatory sign «Wear ear protection»? (fig. 1)

Information and instruction

- 4 Do company-internal regulations clearly regulate for which activities ear protection must be worn?
- 5 Have the employees concerned been instructed about noise hazards, the required protective measures and the correct use of ear protection devices? (fig. 2)

Pregnant women must not work in areas with a sound pressure level of \geq 85 dB(A) (L_{EX} 8 hours) (Art. 11 of the Swiss Ordinance on Maternity Protection at Work).

6 Have employees who are exposed to noise levels above the occupational exposure limit already had hearing checks in the Suva Audiomobile? (fig. 3)

If «no», please contact Suva's Acoustics team – tel.: 041 419 61 34. Suva's precautionary hearing tests are only for employees under the age of 40.
